

INFORMATION FOR NON-MCUI (UC) LICENCE HOLDERS/OVERSEAS COMPETITORS WISHING TO COMPETE IN THE NORTHWEST 200

In order to compete in The North West 200 event, as and a condition of entry, competitors who do not hold a current valid MCUI (UC) licence must obtain starting permission, in writing, from their appropriate Governing Body/Federation.

As a condition of the stated required starting permission, the competitor must hold Personal Accident (PA) insurance for the specific event. It may be possible in some jurisdictions that PA insurance may be obtained directly from the competitor's own Governing Body. A copy of valid PA insurance cover must be submitted with the event entry form (in English language).

In previous years, the MCUI (UC) was able to provide PA insurance cover for overseas competitors, however, this year (2022) the MCUI (UC) is no longer in a position to offer this provision.

Alternatively, to overcome this, PA insurance can be purchased privately by the competitor by contacting The North West 200 who will refer them individually to a specific insurance company who has agreed a rate per event of £294. Start permission from the competitor's own governing body/federation is still required.

As you will appreciate, whilst the MCUI (UC) hopes that such provision will never need to be utilised, it is a necessity, should the competitor need to avail of medical services and repatriation.

The MCUI (UC) would recommend that the minimum limits of indemnity obtained are:-

- Death: EUR 25,000

- Capital Benefits & Permanent Total Disablement: EUR 50,000

- Emergency Medical Expenses: EUR 185,000

- Repatriation Expenses: EUR 100,000
